Subject: Upcoming Huron PI Certification Requirement and System Downtime

The Office of Research is pleased to announce an upcoming upgrade to the Huron Research Suite (HRS). This upgrade will introduce several new features and enhancements supporting the continuous improvement of the university's electronic research administration (eRA) system.

As part of the upgrade, the Principal Investigator (PI) assurance, which has traditionally been documented through a PDF form, is transitioning to a system-tracked task beginning **April 8th**.

This means a PI will now certify each proposal by completing the "Certify" activity on the proposal record in Huron Grants, replacing the previous PDF form submission.

This move to a system-tracked task not only aligns with our commitment to innovation but also ensures better tracking, auditing, and compliance with federal regulations.

To implement the upgrade, **the Huron Research Suite (all modules) will be unavailable from Friday,** April 5th at 5 p.m. until Monday, April 8th at 8 a.m.
